A number of other activities took place in the run up to Christmas including making paracord buddies as well as a number of creations themed around the festive season.

## Spring Term 2017 - Creative Collage and Personal Challenge

In the winter term, the Beavers made significant progress towards their world badge – the theme of world study continued in the spring term with each lodge being set the task of creating a collage detailing everything they could find out about a specific country. Each lodge studied a different country and over the term have created amazing works around their chosen country albeit India, Australia, Spain or China!

Each Beaver was also set two personal challenges at home, from keeping their rooms tidy or learning to swim – the Beavers took up to the challenge with many of them completing these tasks during the course of the term!

We have also had some great sessions where we have had the opportunity to learn how the police work (and get to sit in a police car); we learnt about photography and Beavers were set the challenge of taking their own photographs!

We also had an amazing evening learning about disability and the impact this has on life.

#### Summer Term 2017 - Team Work

This term is all about working together and we have already played a number of team sports. In addition most Beavers came to the Woodhouse camp where we had huge fun playing together, cooking together and having great fun albeit on the adventure course or building a den in the woods!
